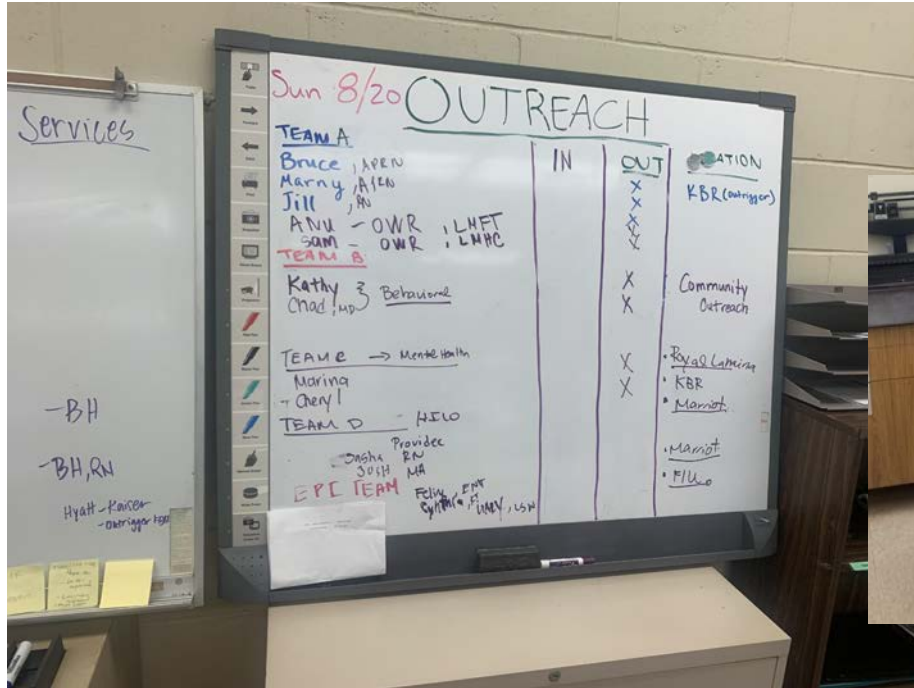


FALSE STATEMENT:

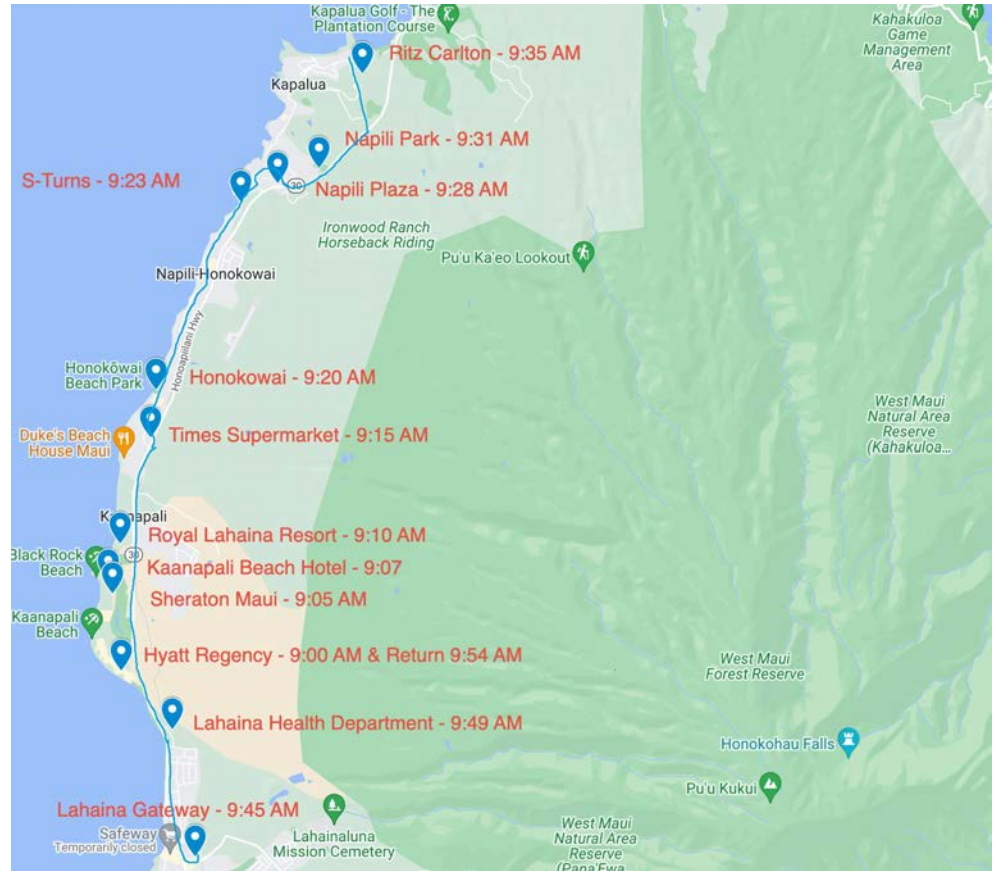
